The meeting had the following objectives:

- Receive an update on the HI Service.
- NASH Program update.
- Update on Security and Access Framework.
- Update on Model Healthcare Community (MHC).
- Receive and update on the NEHTA Communications Plan.

- HI Service introduction.
- Discussion on the NEHTA Engagement Plan.
- Discussion on Tiger Team topics and future planning.

Summary of Actions:

- NEHTA to send high level Business Requirements of NASH Blueprint to group.
- Discussion around the HI Service. Key points covered included the ongoing operation of the Model Healthcare Community (MHC) with over 500 visitors to date; positive feedback on the foundation documents (including Con Ops); and an update on the Public Consultation process. Discussion around vendor adoption and the next steps, with some discussion around certification.
- NEHTA to advise Co-Chair of expected date of NASH Blueprint draft re detailed specifications and services. NEHTA to organise early specification development with SA Health.
- Update on Supply Chain to be presented at the next meeting.
- The group were taken on a tour of the MHC.
- NEHTA to circulate MHC Issues Log to the group for contribution if required.
- NEHTA to provide an update at future meetings on MHC dates.
- NEHTA to advise the group when the HI Service Regulations document is posted on the NEHTA Website.
- Discussion around HI Service introduction. Medicare Australia summarised the detail and statistics provided for the Senate enquiry around the stringent privacy and audit controls within Medicare Australia, ensuring privacy is protected and maintained – which will also be in place for the HI Service.
- NEHTA to circulate minutes from the Pseudonym Workshop once finalised.
- Agreed that a Tiger Team re Reference Architectures to be held (outcome of the HI workshop held with early adopters). For business and ATaRG endorsement.
- Agreed that a workshop to document the removal of the expiry date from Unverified Identifiers.
- Agreed that the 22 and 23 March Tiger Teams to be used for the outstanding use cases.
- Agreed that a NASH Super Tiger Team to be held after NEHTA Board meeting on April 15.
- Agreed that a Security and Access Framework (SAF) Super Tiger Team to be held in early May.
- Representative group to think about who needs to be invited to the strategic super tiger team meetings.
